A Hawai'i that achieves the following:

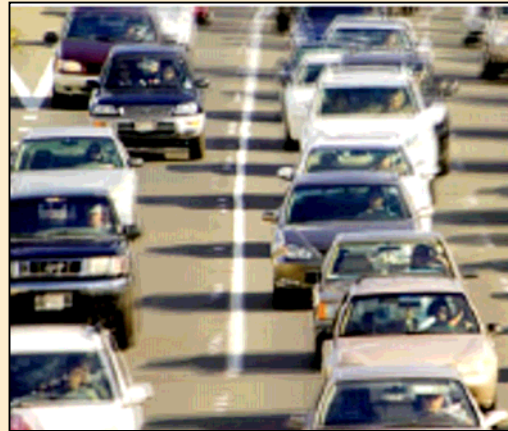
- Respects the culture, character, beauty and history of our state's island communities
